#### **Purpose of the Community Development Framework**



The purpose of this framework is to guide, support and inform the Tasmania Fire Service Community Development Team when engaging with communities to build resilience and when providing guidance on good practice and community development.

The framework facilitates the alignment of service delivery with fire and emergency services strategic directions, state, national and international strategies.

This framework contributes to the Fire and Emergency Services Strategic Plan – Framing the Future. The business of the Community Development and Education Unit is guided by the Division of Community Fire Safety Business Plan and the Unit Business Plan.

## **Vision**

A Tasmanian community safer and more resilient to the impact of fire and other hazards.

### **Mission**

To empower the community to prevent, prepare and respond to fire and other hazards.

#### **Objectives**



Through a community development approach:

- Enhance community preparedness levels for fire and other hazards.
- Engage with internal and external stakeholders, including communities, to develop and implement good practice local resilience strategies.
- Provide up-to-date information to allow community members to make informed decisions about what actions to take in an emergency.
- Apply good practice, innovation and continuous improvement, including documenting and evaluating community outcomes in behavioural change.

#### **Community Development Principles**

The following principles have been adapted from the AIDR Community Engagement for Disaster Resilience Handbook 2020.

TFS seeks to uphold these principles when undertaking community development activities with Tasmanian communities.

#### Place the community at the centre

Effective community engagement is responsive, flexible, and recognises the community as the central reference point for planning, implementing and measuring success in any engagement process. Inclusive, respectful and ethical relationships between engagement partners and the community must guide every stage of the engagement process.



#### **Understand the context**

Effective community engagement requires partners to develop a strong understanding of the unique history, values, diversity, dynamics, strengths, priorities and needs of each community.

It is also important to understand the environmental, political, or historical context that surrounds any hazard, emergency event or disaster.

#### **Recognise complexity**

Effective community engagement considers the complex and dynamic nature of hazards, disaster risk and emergency events, and the diverse identities, histories, composition, circumstances, strengths and needs of communities and community members.

#### **Work in partnership**

Effective community engagement requires a planned and coordinated approach between the community and partners at every stage of the process. Potential issues arising from any imbalance in power, information or resources between the community and partners will be proactively managed during the process.

#### **Communicate respectfully and inclusively**

Community engagement is built on effective communication between the community and partners that recognises the diverse strengths, needs, values and priorities of both community members and partners.

#### **Recognise and build capability**

Effective community engagement recognises, supports and builds on individual, community and organisational capability and capacity to reduce disaster and home fire safety risk and increase resilience.
